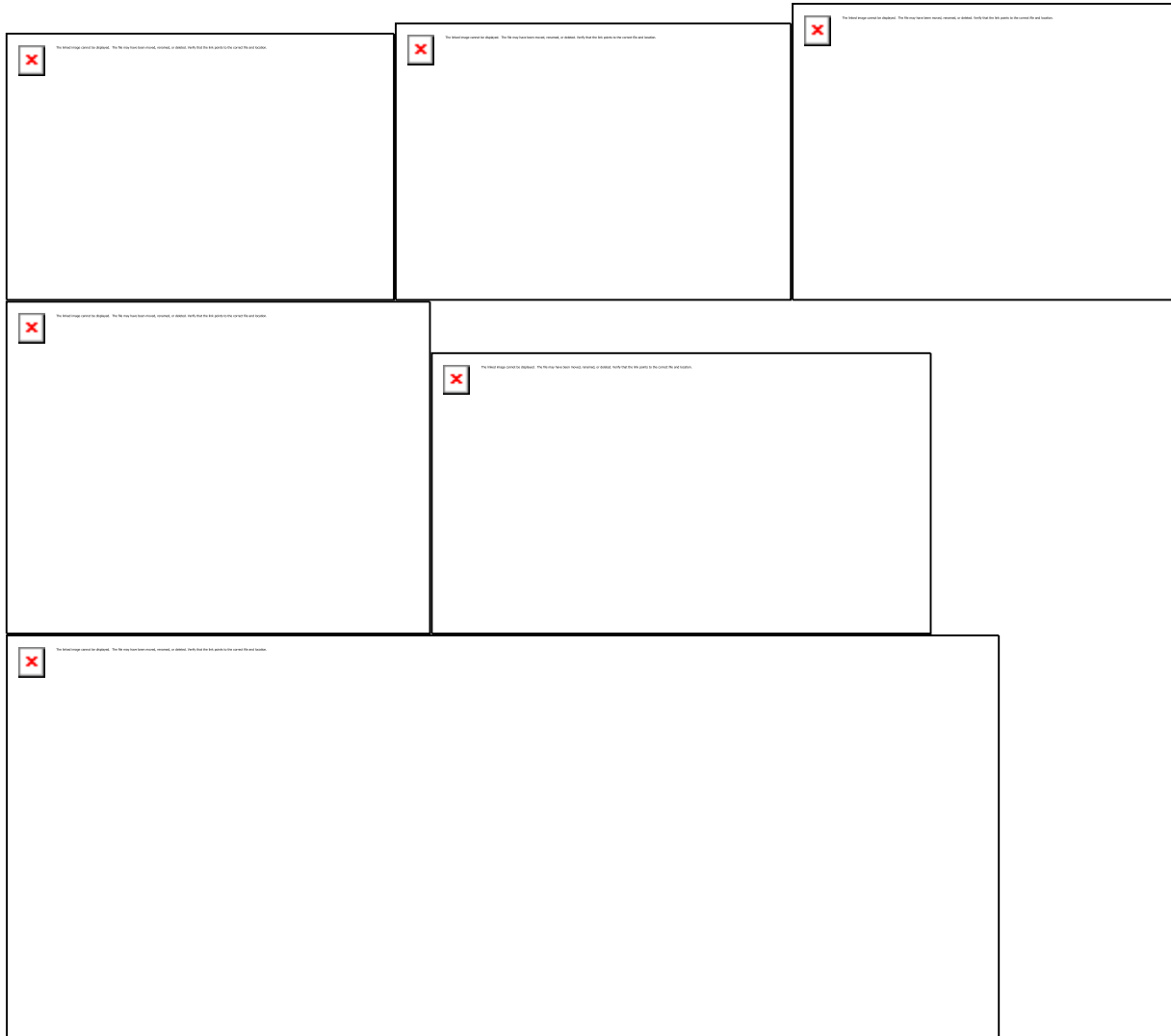

#### AP Biology Students Prove They Have Green Thumb After All!!




In preparation for their upcoming lab on transpiration the AP biology students in Mrs. Huntington's class had to get their hands dirty and first grow their own plants for testing. They had to mix their own soil with water, prepare the planter bed and plant the seeds at the required depth. Then they had to nurture them and keep them watered and in the sunlight so that they would grow into viable plants that they could use in the upcoming lab in two weeks. Each plant must have 3-4 viable leaves before they can begin the experiment and start collecting their data so they are kept their fingers crossed that a few of the seedlings



would continue to prosper and they did! They were able to complete the lab this week and here are a few photos of the fun!





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### Let There Be Light!!!!

Mrs. Huntington's Biology class also got in on the fun and explored the world of plants. They looked at how the different wavelengths of light affect the rate of photosynthesis.

They had to decide which color of filter they wanted to use for their light, how they were going to provide the plants with carbon dioxide and how they would know when it was photosynthesizing!





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
